Notes:

- G-1: As of 12/31/2019 there were no Annual Dues for the Southwest Shore Association. Prior to 2015 the Annual Dues were \$100 per cabin. Payments were less than usual in 2011 and 2014, perhaps because of the economy. Beginning in 2020, Annual Dues will be \$50 per cabin.
- G-2: A commemorative Centennial History Album was created for the 2012 Centennial Celebration. The cost of each album was approximately \$60 per album. The Association gave one free album to each of the 61 cabins that had paid its annual dues in at least two of the past three years. Owners and family members purchased additional albums by remitting money to the Association, which placed a bulk order for over 100 total albums.
- G-3: The Centennial Celebration on July 7, 2012 consisted of an afternoon of games, activities, activities, and refreshments, followed by a catered barbecue dinner, beverages, and dessert. The Association paid for the entire event from Annual Dues payments accumulated over the years. A deposit of \$1,500 was given to the caterer prior to the event, and the balance of costs was paid to the vendors when the event was complete. The total cost of the Centennial Celebration was estimated to be about \$5,000, including the \$1,500 deposit. The final total was \$5,648.05. We had a similar Summer Celebration in 2016, at a total cost of \$5,270.88.
- G-4: For the past few years an annual brush and debris removal project has been sponsored by the Association to encourage clearance of fire fuels and overgrown vegetation. In 2010-2012 the brush removal was done at no charge to our Association, thanks to volunteer labor and grants obtained by Jack Whitaker (Cabin 66) from the Big Bear fire prevention and "healthy forests" local project funding.
- G-5: A deposit of \$4,000 was paid to Greg Geers, MAI, to engage his services for the 2008 Forest Service appraisals, which began in Sept 2009; an additional \$13,487.50 was paid in Dec 2009. Final payment of \$3,343.75 was paid in 2011, bringing the grand total for consulting services related to the 2008 Forest Service appraisal to \$20,831.25.
- G-6: For the past several years the Association has contributed \$1,500 to National Forest Homeowners to support their legislative effort on the Cabin Fee Act. In 2011 we accelerated our normal 2012 payment into 2011 to respond to an urgent NFH need for funding. In 2016 and 2019, we paid for SWS reps to attend the Annual NFH Conference.
- G-7: At the end of 2018, the remaining balance in the Southwest Shore Healthy Forest Association (SWS-HFA) bank account was transferred to the SWS Association General Fund. The remaining "Other Income" (\$0.71) was Bank Interest.

Notes:

C-1: Total cash on hand at the end of each period consists of the balance in the General Fund, less the \$5,152.65 that was advanced during 2002-2007 to pay for some expenditures related to the 1998 reappraisal effort for Category 1 and 2 lots. That loan amount was repaid during 2012.

R-1: During 2000-2004 various expenditures were incurred to protest the 1998 Forest Service appraisals of Lot Category 1 (lake front) and Category 2 (lake view). Total expenditures exceeded the amount collected from cabin owners by \$5,152.65, which was advanced by the General Fund. That loan amount was repaid during 2012.
